A 501c3 Nonprofit Organization

Shelter to Soldier is a 501c3 nonprofit organization that adopts dogs from local rescues and shelters and trains them to become psychiatric service dogs for post-9/11 veterans suffering from Post Traumatic Stress (PTS), Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) and/or Military Sexual Trauma (MST). The program also places emotional support animals (ESAs) with active-duty military, veterans, and first responders in need and deploys the Shelter to Soldier Canine Ambassadors, a team of therapy dogs, to provide visits of love and comfort to local military personnel, veterans, and their families.

Shelter to Soldier is excited to introduce Raider and Lady, the latest pups making a positive impact in our program! These dogs are currently in training as a "morale dog" through Shelter to Soldier's Canine Ambassador program. This initiative is designed to bring comfort and boost morale among active-duty Navy and Marines aboard US Navy ships during deployment. Their roles are part of Shelter to Soldier's ongoing mission to support the mental well-being of those who bravely serve our country.

Raider, a one-year-old Lab mix adopted from Labs and More Rescue and generously sponsored by **Karen and Jeff Shabel**, was officially commissioned as a Lieutenant aboard the USS Makin Island in November 2025, marking his formal welcome as a member of the ship's crew.

SPONSORSHIPS | MAKE A DIFFERENCE

\$22,000

Each service dog/veteran team costs our program an average of \$22,000 from adoption to graduation. This includes the adoption, housing, medical care, grooming, food, treats, training, training equipment, bedding, toys, testing, handling training, service dog equipment and documents, graduation and materials for the veteran recipient and service dog pair.

Shelter to Soldier dogs are trained over 12-18 months to be highly obedient and handler-focused in all environments, to ignore distractions, and to mitigate symptoms of stress, anxiety, and depression through task-related work.

Shelter to Soldier visits local shelters and rescue groups and evaluates dogs 11 months to 1.5 years of age, of any breed, weighing 45-70 lbs, and in good health for our service dog training program.

We evaluate temperament for: desire to work and have a job, food or moderate toy drive, the way the dog handles new environments, people and noises, and an overall stable and social demeanor.





Upon qualified match – **veteran handlers train for an average of 7 months** time depending upon handling abilities and how well the team picks up on training.

Handlers learn to communicate effectively with their dog to create a loving bond while learning all commands and service dog laws/regulations to prepare them for a life with a service animal.

We celebrate the dedication of the dog and handler once they successfully complete all necessary training and pass required tests.

This is where the journey truly begins for the veteran/service dog team!

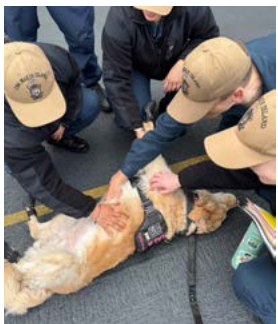

"I'm a retired Major who served 27 years; 7 as an enlisted communications Marine, 4 as a logistics officer, and 16 as an artillery officer. 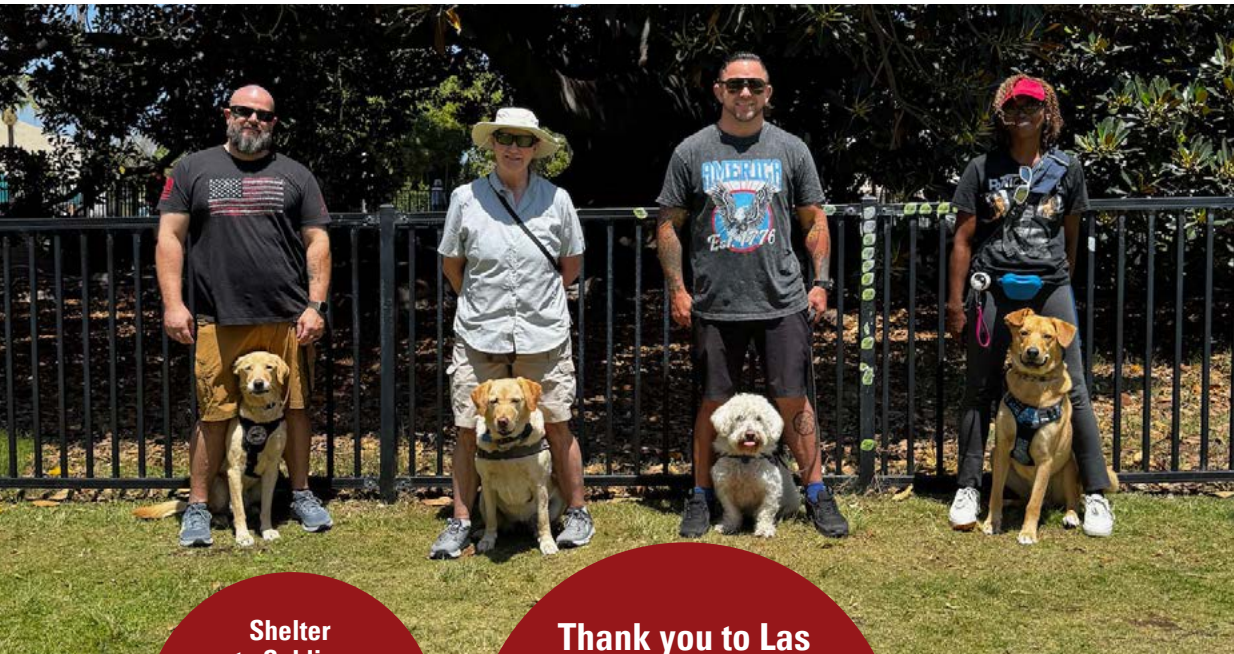

Approved veteran applicants have the opportunity to attend one-on-one therapy sessions with our mental health liaison, David Moss LCSW, at no cost to the patient.

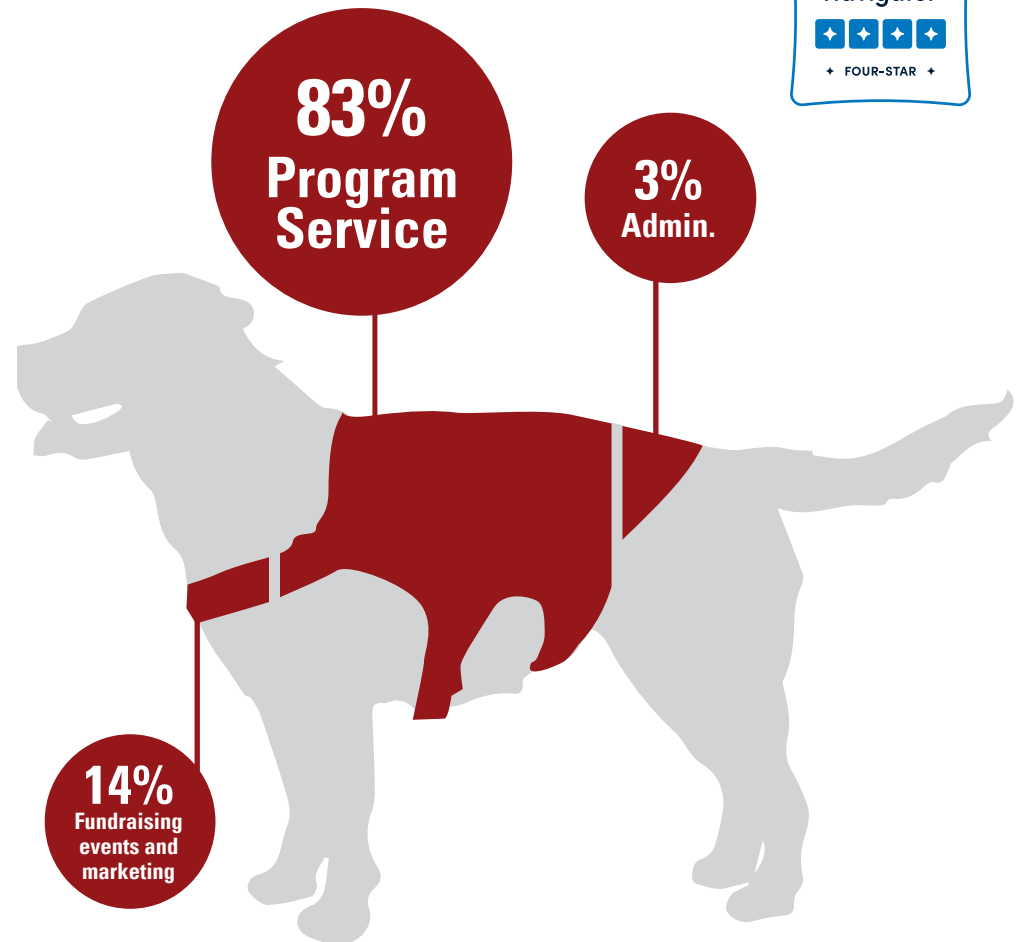
